The Forest Preserve District of Kane County provides many outdoor opportunities, including camping and trails. Camp sites are accessible to many hiking trails, allowing patrons a chance to observe the abundant plants and wildlife of beautiful Kane County.

Paul Wolff Campground

Paul Wolff Campground is located at 38W235 Big Timber Rd., within Burnidge Forest Preserve. The campground is 1.5 miles west of Randall Road in Elgin.

Nearly 600 acres of rolling hills and woodlands contain:

- 90 improved camp sites with 50-amp service, water access, parking pad & fire ring (vehicles or tents)
- 10 primitive sites (tents only)
- 5 equestrian camp sites
- 2 dump stations
- 9 miles of trails including a 2.25-mile, multi-purpose trail suitable for hiking, biking or equestrian use
- Stocked fish ponds

Camp Site Registration & Rules

Please see the campground office for camp site registration and firewood between 3-9 p.m. Firewood may not be brought into Kane County forest preserves or into Paul Wolff Campground due to state restrictions on the transport of firewood for pest control.

Registration is valid for up to seven days, with 14 days maximum in any 21-day period. A camp unit may not be left unoccupied for more than 12 hours.

Each camp site requires one adult registrant. Registrants must be at least 21 years of age and remain on site for the duration of the camp permit.

No alcohol is permitted.

Quiet Hours

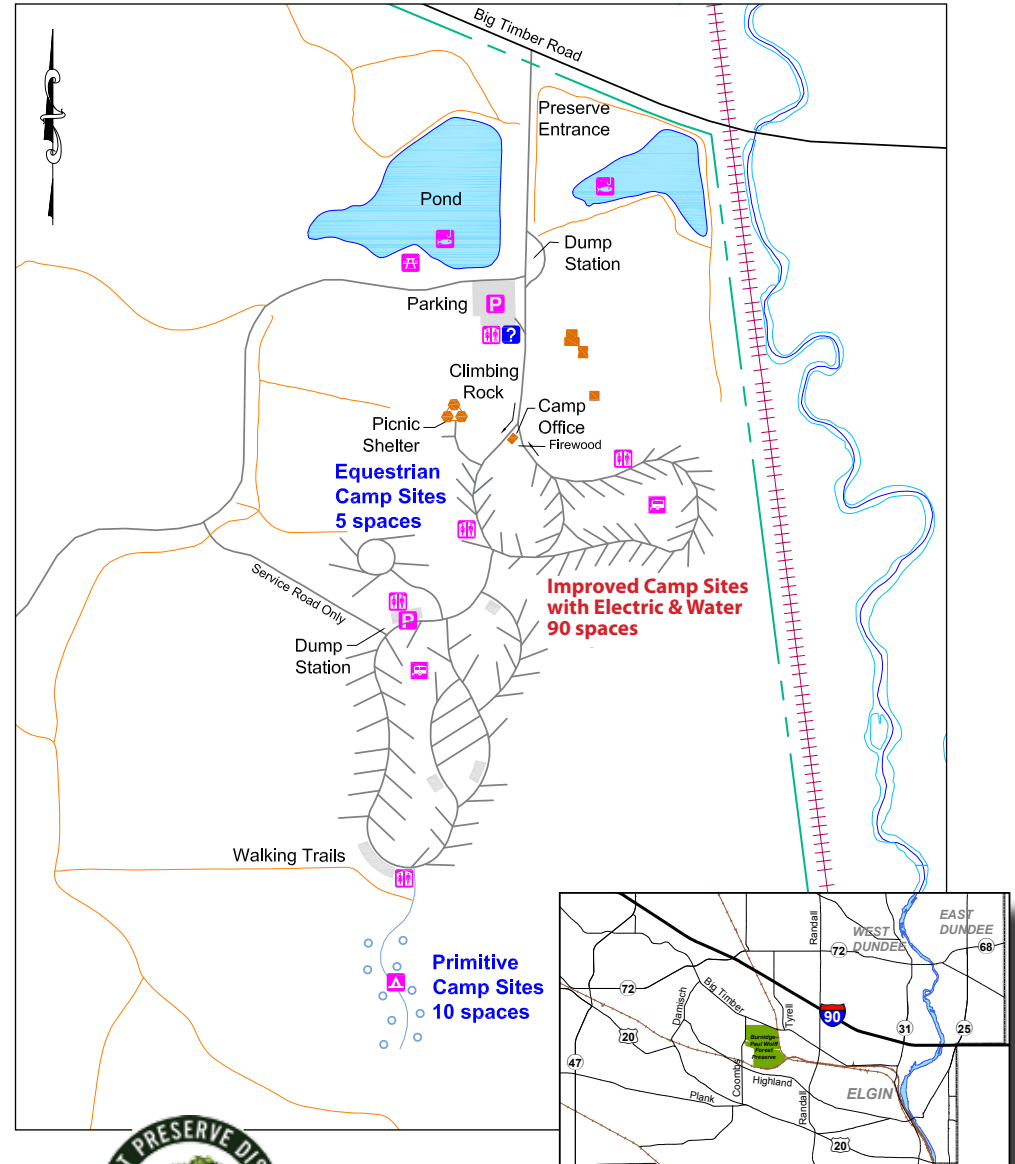
Please respect others' camping experience. Quiet hours are between 10 p.m. and 8 a.m.
