

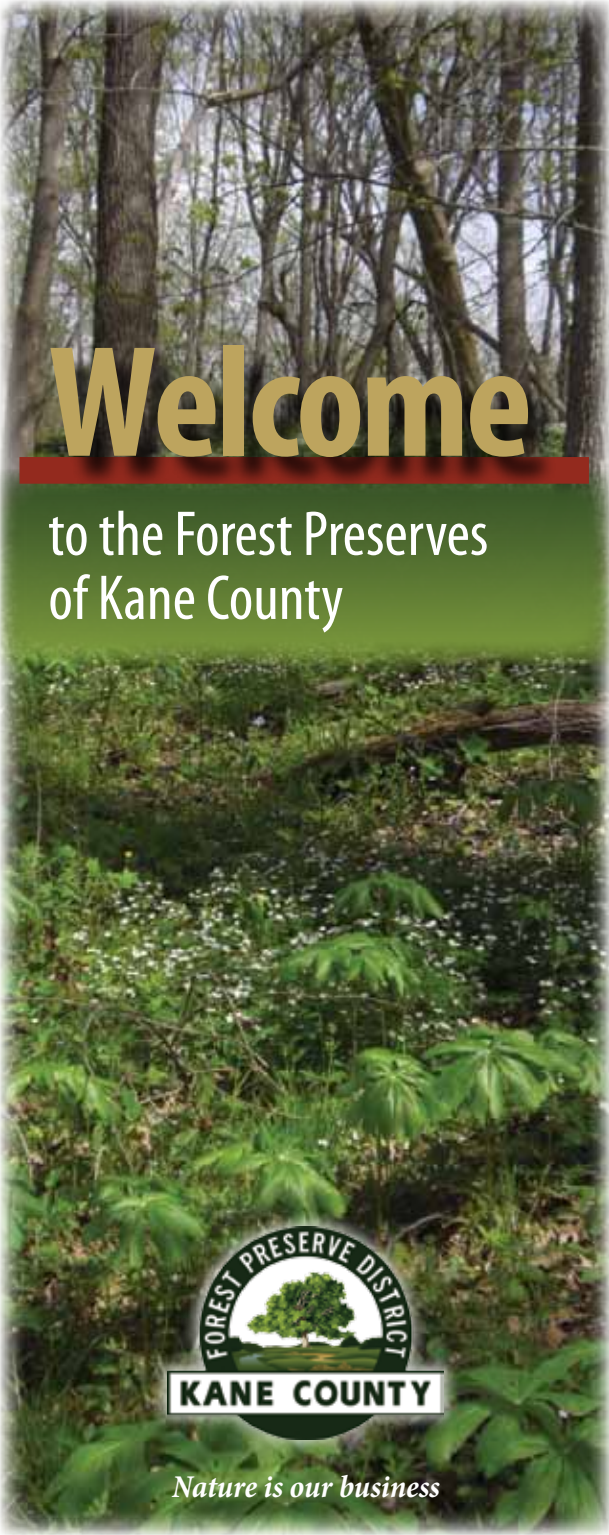

FIRES

Keep fires contained in the provided fireplaces and grills. Please discard ashes or charcoal in hot coal containers or soak hot ashes before leaving.

PETS

Pets are welcome but **must be leashed at all times** and kept under their owner's control (unless in a designated off-leash area). This protects pets and visitors as well as native plants and animals. Designated off-leash dog areas include portions of Aurora West Forest Preserve, Fox River Bluff West Forest Preserve, and the enclosed area at Schweizer Woods Forest Preserve. **Pets are not permitted in areas designated as Natural Areas Restoration.**

NATURAL AREAS RESTORATION

Intra prairies, woodlands and wetlands comprise such a small part of the entire county. The District is working to both enhance the remaining fragments of these important habitats and to create large-scale natural areas. Returning numerous acres of old field and crop field back to native prairie and controlling invasive brush in our woods

The District recognizes the importance of preserving and protecting the natural heritage of Kane County. Truly unique areas in the District have been designated as Illinois State Nature Preserves, including:

- Bliss Woods
- Dick Young
- Helm Woods
- LeRoy Oakes
- Johnson's Mound
- Freeman Kane/Meagher
- Burlington Prairie
- Underwood Prairie Preserve

These preserves contain natural areas where the native plant community survives and represents the original nature of Kane County. As such, active recreational options at the above preserves is intentionally limited. Sadly, these special areas are only a small fraction of the land owned by the District. However, it is the intent of the District to use these natural areas as examples to restore altered lands to a condition similar to that of the past. Natural areas are available for viewing, but please remain on trails in these areas to have a minimum impact on these precious jewels of our county.

What More Can Citizens Do? Visit your local preserve and enjoy the beauty of nature! Remember to leave plants and animals in their natural habitat and not stray from designated pathways. Whether hiking through fields or woods, biking on a trail, camping at a campground, stopping for a few minutes, or spending the day, the preserves exist for the education, recreation and pleasure of all Kane County citizens.

Fabyan Villa Museum
Colonel George and Nelle Fabyan came to the Fox River Valley in the early 1900s and purchased 10 acres south of Geneva. They developed the farm into an estate of nearly 600 acres called "Riverbank," which became a showplace in Illinois. The Villa, a 1907 Frank Lloyd Wright redesign, contains Fabyan memorabilia. **Call the Fabyan Villa Museum at (630) 232-4811 for information.**

Pioneer Sholes School
The Pioneer Sholes School at LeRoy Oakes Forest Preserve in St. Charles is an authentically restored and furnished one room country school, used regularly as a classroom by students and teachers who want to relive a school day as it was 100 years ago. Curriculum materials are available upon request. A collection of 19th and early 20th century school texts, early official Kane County education records, and oral histories of one room schools are a few of the school's features. is a brick farmstead built in a simple Greek Revival style. The house has been restored as a living history museum representing the lifestyle and the furnishings of the 1840s. A frame addition contains a kitchen and bathroom furnished to represent the Victorian era. Recreation

SHELTER RENTAL / RESERVATIONS

Shelters may be reserved by calling (630) 232-1242 on weekdays, 8:30 - 11:30 a.m. and 1:30 - 4:30 p.m.

In most cases, nominal shelter rental fees apply. For most small shelters (25-49 people), rental rates are \$25 for Kane County residents and \$35 for out-of-county residents. For most large shelters (50-100 people), rental fees are \$50 for Kane County residents and \$75 for out-of-county residents. Reservations open for the year on January 2. Unless reserved, the shelters are available on a first-come, first-served basis.



BIKE TRAILS

Four regional trails — including the Fox River Trail, Great Western Trail, Virgil Gilman Trail, and branches of the Illinois Prairie Path — wind their way through Kane County for approximately 85 miles. Whether built over abandoned railroad right-of-ways or along the Fox River, the trails enable you to see the beauty of the area. Trails are eight feet wide and surfaced with asphalt or packed limestone screenings. The trails are marked with universal safety signs every mile to locate users in an emergency. **No motorized vehicles including dirt bikes, golf carts or ATVs are permitted on forest preserve property at any time.** Mountain/off-road bicycles are restricted to District-designated trail use only.

EQUESTRIAN RIDING AREAS

Most horse trails are natural surface, mowed grass paths or limestone screenings. Limestone screenings trails and asphalt bike trails are available in some of the preserves. These are multi-use trails shared with runners, bicyclists, dog walkers etc. Horse riders are required to stay on designated, forest preserve-maintained trails. Trail riding is not allowed in restricted natural areas, Illinois Nature Preserves, picnic areas or in farmed areas. To prevent trail damage during wet weather, trails may be temporarily closed. Individual forest preserves will post a sign at the entrance when horse trails are closed.

CAMPING

Public camping is available from May 1 - October 31 at the Paul Wolf Campground within the Burnidge Forest Preserve in Elgin. There are 90 improved camp sites with 50-amp service, water access, parking pad and fire ring; 10 primitive sites for tents only; and 5 equestrian camping areas. All are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Reservations are not accepted. Two dump stations are available. Burnidge Forest Preserve includes nine miles of hiking trails including a 2.25-mile, multi-purpose trail suitable for hiking, biking or equestrian use, a play climbing rock and stocked fish ponds. **Information on Paul Wolf Campground is available at (630) 444-1200.**

YOUTH CAMPING AREAS

Certain camping areas are exclusively reserved for scouts and organized youth groups. Camp Tomo Chi-Chi Knolls in Gilberts is a designated youth camping area. Six separate camp sites will each host 25 youth campers for a total of 150. Available amenities include large, mowed common areas, shelter, hiking trails, and the Tomo Lodge with seating for 100. LeRoy Oakes Forest Preserve in St. Charles has eight youth camping sites with a common firebowl. The site will host 25 campers per site for a total of 200. **To inquire about youth camping reservations, call (630) 232-1242.**

BOAT/CANOE LAUNCHES

All watercraft must be used in accordance with posted District rules as well as all applicable U.S. and Illinois statutes. Within forest preserves, only trolling motors (no gasoline motors) are permitted. The Fox River is the only location where gasoline motors are allowed. Boats or canoes are only permitted in preserves with designated boat or canoe launches.

FISHING

Fishing is permitted in all District lakes, streams and rivers, with the exception of Illinois Nature Preserves. Fishing is permitted on both sides of the Fox River. **For more information on fishing in Illinois, visit the Illinois Department of Natural Resources at dnr.illinois.gov.**

GOLF COURSES

Settler's Hill Golf Course
Settler's Hill Golf Course is located at 919 E. Fabyan Pkwy. in Batavia. The 18-hole course is 6,449 yards, par 72, rating 70.2 and the slope is 119. Settlers Hill is a bent-grass golf course with many elevated tees and a panoramic view from the 14th green. **Call (630) 232-1636 for rates and information.**

Hughes Creek Golf Club

Hughes Creek Golf Club is located at 1749 Spring Valley Dr., off Hughes Road in Elburn. This 18-hole course is 6,506 yards with a par 72. **Call (630) 365-9200 for rates and information.**

Deer Valley Golf Course

Deer Valley Golf Course is located at 46W994 Jericho Rd. in Big Rock, five miles west of Route 47. This 9-hole course is 1,358 yards with a par 29. Big Rock Creek winds through this rolling course adjacent to Big Rock Forest Preserve. **Call (630) 556-3333 for rates and information.**

PHILIP B. ELFSTROM STADIUM

The District-owned Philip B. Elfstrom Stadium is home to the Kane County Cougars, a Class A minor league baseball team. **Call (630) 232-8811 for information or Kane County Cougars tickets.**



WINTER ACTIVITIES

Enjoy winter activities in the Kane County forest preserves! Cross-country skiing and snowshoeing are permitted at all preserves, however, the District does not groom trails for winter activities. Sledding and snowmobiling are permitted in designated areas, when the ground is frozen and there are at least four inches of snow. All state and local regulations relating to the operation of snowmobiles apply. Ice fishing and ice skating are also permitted in designated areas. Snowboarding is available at the independently operated Raging Buffalo, within Buffalo Park Forest Preserve. Please note: All winter activities are at your own risk.

THE LODGE AT BREWSTER CREEK

Host your special event at The Lodge at Brewster Creek in Saint Charles. With multiple meeting rooms, seating for 100+ on the main level, a catering kitchen, outdoor deck and a beautiful, 27-acre forest preserve setting, this is the perfect place for your next event or corporate function. Brewster Creek Forest Preserve is located at 6N921 Illinois Route 25. Fabyan Windmill

Rising up from the east side of Fabyan Forest Preserve is the 68-foot Fabyan Windmill, listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Two German craftsmen originally built the windmill in 1875, on a site now part of Lombard. In 1914, George Fabyan purchased the mill and had it moved to his Riverbank Estate in Geneva. The Forest Preserve District purchased Fabyan's 600-acre estate — including the windmill — in 1937. A three-year restoration of the windmill was completed in 2004. Volunteer millers and docents lead tours from 1-4 p.m. on weekends from mid-May through mid-October. Self-guided tours are also available on weekends. **For more information, or to schedule a weekday group tour, call (630) 208-8662.**



Fabyan Japanese Tea Garden
